Y. I. Club Members and Parents

I need your help! Last year Lutheran Church Extension Fund changed the way they handle deposits. Previously we bought round stickers for \$1 each and affixed them to collection sheets for your child. When 25 stickers were on the sheet we sent it home with a postage paid addressed envelope for parents to fill out and mail. Now we stamp a sheet and send it with a check from my personal account when it reaches \$25. Several parents have not sent these to LCEF. After six months LCEF considers the check "stale" and does not honor it. Your child does not receive credit for the deposit or the interest that would accrue and I cannot clear my checking account. If you are holding a check more than six months old you can return it to me and I will write you a new one. If the check is less than the \$25 I do have a record but can only refund the amount of the stamps, not the stickers. If the sheet has \$25 in stickers it can still be sent and the deposit credited. Please send deposits to LCEF promptly when I send home the completed sheets. If your child has an open LCEF account and you do not wish to worry about it I will send in the deposit for you if you give me your child's account number.
